

Rebels March Over Redemptorist, 18-0

LeBlanc, Chapoton Do All Nicholls Scoring

Nicholls unleashed a double barrel, non-stoppable attack in the persons of Ronald Chapoton and Nolan LeBlanc, and moved on to a thrilling 18-0 victory over the Redemptorist Rams Friday night at City Park stadium to give their home-coming celebration the victorious touch.

The two lads accounted for all three of the Rebel touchdowns.

Chapoton, who put on a terrific display of offensive and defensive football, scored two of the touchdowns. He intercepted two passes, one with 22 sec-

onds remaining in the second period when the Rams had their only scoring chance. The scoring opportunity came when Chuck St. Philip of the Johnny Rebs was unable to get off a fourth down punt and the Rams took over on downs at the Rebel 17-yard line. Louis Saladino dropped back to pass on the first play and Chapoton intercepted the ball in the end zone for a touchback, giving Nicholls the ball on their 20-yard line.

Late in the game he intercepted his second aerial at the Rebs 44 when the Rams tried desperately to score through the air.

Only once during the game, and that was in the late stages, did the Rams get off for a rushing gain of two figures.

Nicholls went 64-42 and 10 yards for its scores. The charges of Don Fortier, and his assistants Moose Porter and Ray Froeba, looked mighty sharp. They held the Rams to 26 yards rushing in the first half, which they controlled. Redemptorist ran nine running plays and threw three passes, two of which were intercepted, in the first two periods of play.

Redemptorist started off in splendid fashion, moving to a quick first down in three plays, but on the second series of plays, after failing to gain on two attempts, Louis Saladino took to the air and Oscar Wible—who did a splendid job at the quarterback slot—stepped in, intercepted the ball at the Rebel 20 and returned it to the Nicholls 36-yard line. From here the Rebels moved 64 yards to the game's first touchdown with only Chapoton and LeBlanc carrying the mail.

Chapoton scored from the 42-yard line with one minute and 14 seconds left in the opening period. Joe Thomas failed on the attempted conversion.

Nicholls came right back and got possession of the ball on the second play following the kickoff when Tommy Nides fumbled and Ricky Crespo recovered at the Rams 42-yard line.

Again the unstoppable two took things into their own hands and

moved down to the Redemptorist two from where Chapoton again took it over. Again Thomas failed on his attempted conversion. The score came with 8 minutes and 36 seconds left in the first half.

Redemptorist took the kickoff after the second Rebel touch-down and moved to a first down in two plays on an eight-yard pass from Saladino to Vic Helm and a three-yard run by John Olavsen. On the second series of downs, the Rams suffered a five-yard penalty and were not able to recover this yardage and were forced to punt. Saladino punted 37 yards from midfield to the Rebs 13.

Nicholls moving the ball with success, got two first downs, but they too failed to recover from a five yard penalty after and had to punt. St. Phillip could not get off the kick after a bad pass from center and the Rams took over at the 17.

Redemptorist showed its only real drive in the third period when they got the ball following a punt by St. Phillip which they returned to their 25-yard line.

In two plays the Rams had a first down, two more plays netted them another first down, and in three plays they had their third straight first down. A third down run by Saladino brought them their best gain of the night and their fourth first down in succession, putting the ball on the Rebel 26. On the first play from that spot Pat Scully fumbled and Arthur Boe recovered for the Rebels at the Nicholls 23-yard line. That stopped the Rams chances of getting back in the ball game and set the Rebels on their way to victory.

Nicholls moved the ball from their 23 to the Rams 19—where a fumble stopped them at the Rams 17-yard line.

Redemptorist started to move the ball, but a penalty set them back and they had to punt, Saladino kicking out on the 48-yard line of the Rebels.

Nicholls, for the first time failed, to move the ball with any amount of success and had to punt. St. Phillip punted and the Rams safety man signaled for a fair catch, but he missed the ball and Nicholls recovered at the 10, from where LeBlanc scored on a 10-yard end run on the first play.
