May 9 - Geraldine - Granddaughter, Geraldine Roat.

May 14 - Celia - Daughter-in-law, Celia (Johnson) Thomas, wife of Roy Thomas, Nellie's son.

May 14 - Edith, Mrs. Finley - unknown persons.

May 15 - "Boys" - Probably the twin sons of Roy and Celia Thomas.

May 17 - Aunt Carrie and Aunt Nina - Nellie's aunts, Caroline (Moore) Lamson and Cornelia (Moore) Cresswell - lived in Saginaw, Michigan.

Jun 1 - Ida and Laura Fersturburg - unknown persons.

Jun 2 - Cousin Lola - unknown person.

Jun 4 - Eileen - unknown person.

Jun 5 - John - Dear John's birthday, refers to Nellie's son, John William Thomas who died in 1918.

Jun 6 - Mr. Rogers, - might refer to the adopted father of Celia (Johnson-Rogers) Thomas, wife of Roy Thomas. She was "adopted" by Thomas and Celia Rogers.

Jun 6 - Vine Benson and Mrs. Maitland - unknown persons. In Nellie's 1923 diary she mentions a Vine Benton.

Jun 7 - Gladis _____ Cooper and husband - unknown persons.

Jun 11 - Mrs. Stahl - unknown person.

Oct 14 - Miss Andrews - unknown person. Later diary entries may indicate her name as Ella Andrews.

Nov 3 - Walter and Laura - Walter Joseph Lamson and wife Laura (McDonald) Lamson. Walter was the son of Caroline (Moore) Lamson, who was Nellie's sister, Caroline Moore being the sister of Nellie's mother.

Nov 4 - Arthur and Reva - Arthur Edward Vosburg and wife Reve (Truesdell) Lamson. Arthur was the son of Mary Sophia Lamson and James Vosburg, Mary Sophia Lamson being the daughter of Caroline (Moore) Lamson and James Lamson.
