Jan 26 - May Donnelly refers to May Ella Cresswell who married Renbue W. Donley [or Donnelly?] who lived in Saginaw, Michigan. Her parents were Thomas Cresswell and Cornelia Moore [aka Nena]. Cornelia Moore was a sister to Nellie's mother, making her Nellie's aunt and May her niece.

Jan 27 - Aunt Carrie refers to Caroline (Moore) Lamson, a sister to Nellie's mother, making her Nellie's aunt.

Jan 28 - Aunt Deal refers to Cordelia (Moore) McCullen, a sister to Nellie's mother, making her Nellie's aunt. Aunt Nena refers to Cornelia (Moore) Cresswell, another sister to Nellie's mother.

Feb 1 - Laura - This Laura refers to Laura (McDonald) Lamson, wife of Walter Lamson. Walter refers to Walter Lamson, son of Valorus Lamson and Caroline aka Carrie (Moore) Lamson.

Jan 29 - Jesse aka Jess aka J. L. & Kate refers to Nellie's daughter Katharine Thomas and her husband Jesse Roat. Their children were Marguerite aka simply M., Geraldine aka Gerry or Jerry, etc., Katharine "Kitty", Eleanor, Marion "Betty" or Bettie, Bob aka Bobs.

Mar 14 - R. or Roy aka R. C. refers to Nellie's son Roy Cresswell Thomas. His wife was Celia and they had twin boys, William "Bill" and John "Jack" Thomas born in 1914.

May 21 - Mrs. Case or Mrs. Dr. Case - refers to a friend of Nellie Thomas.

May 23 - Hattie - Might refer to Harriet "Hattie" Wycoff the wife of Ransom Henry Peek.

May 30 - Tommie [?] - unknown person.

May 31 - Mrs. Gibson - unknown person.

June 3 - "Hattie, Leon and I" - Hattie and Leon probably refers to Harriet "Hattie" Wycoff Peek the wife of Ransom Peek. Leon probably refers to her son Leon, born 1914.

June 7 - Ollie [?] - unknown person

June 24 - Mr. and Mrs. Seeley - unknown persons

June 24 - Ransum [?] - Probably refers to Ransom Henry Peek, son of George Peek and Louise "Lucy" McQuigg. Ransom Peek was married to Harriet "Hattie" Wycoff.

June 24 - Uncle Lee and John McQuigg - unknown persons. John McQuigg is probably the brother of Catharine McQuigg who married (1) Norman Eaton and (2) John D. Thomas. Catharine McQuigg and Norman Eaton "adopted" Nellie Bates after the death of her mother, Matilda Moore Bates.

June 24 - Mr. and Mrs. Finney - unknown persons.

June 29 - Lula and "Halls" - unknown persons. Lula might be Lula (Hirsch) Shepard, wife of Raymond "Ray" Shepard whose parents were Sidney Shepard and Martha Peek.

Jun 29 - Olive - Might refer to Olive Adelia Peek, a single woman, the daughter of George Peek and Louise "Lucy" McQuigg.

July 1 - Laura & George - May refer to Laura Peek the wife of George Schlesser. Laura was the daughter of Ransom Peek and Harriet "Hattie" Wycoff.

July 4 - Tommie [?], Gerny [Gerry?] - unknown person

Jul 10 - The Vartys - Friends and/or neighbors of Jesse & Kate Roat in Flint, MI.

Jul 14 - Jerry, Tommie, Chet - unknown persons.

Jul 19 - Cousin Lois - Lois and Sam. Cousin Lois might be Lois Arvilla (Peek) Davis but no one named Sam is known to be connected to her.

Jul 29 - Little Norma Jene - unknown person.

Jul 31 - Amy - might refer to Amy Shepard, a single woman, daughter of Sidney Shepard and Martha Peek.

Sep 22 - Miss Andrews, Mrs. Wittimere [?], Mrs. Rebe - unknown person.

Sep 23 - Mr. Bluefield - unknown person.

Sep 26 - Mrs. Goss [?] - unknown person.

Sep 29 - Mrs. Suits [?] - unknown person.

Oct 2 - Harve and Lil - unknown persons.

Oct 3 - McRuby [?] - unknown person.

Oct 4 - Vine and Allie - unknown persons. In Nellie's 1920 diary she mentions a Vine Benson. In her 1923 diary she mentions a Vine Benton. These may refer to this Vine.

Oct 27 - Evelyn - unknown person.

Nov 3 - Clifford, Margret - unknown persons.

Nov 3 - Harold - unknown person.

Nov 3 - Mr. and Mrs. Roat refers to the parents of Jesse Roat. Frank probably refers to the foster son of Mr. and Mrs. Roat.

Nov 8 - Mrs. Bergers - unknown persons.

Nov 10 - Elwood[s] - unknown person. This might refer to Elwood Carlson, neighbor to Roat family.

Nov 15 - Mrs. Bramlet - unknown person.

Nov 21 - Nellie's husband - unknown person - does not refer to herself.

Nov 22 - Mrs. Cooly and Mrs. Pomeroy - unknown persons.

Nov 23 - Mr. G. - unknown person.

Nov 26 - Mrs. Gaud [?] - unknown person.

Dec 5 - Miss Hill and Miss Bachtell - unknown persons.

Dec 12 - Mrs. Hudson - unknown person. John and Fronia probably refers to John and Fronia Swayze who lived in Fort Wayne, Indiana. See the 1922 diary for additional information about them.

Residences or Trips:

Jan 1-26 - Unknown location, probably living in Flint, Michigan.

Jan 27 - Feb 2 - In Saginaw, MI after the death of May (Cresswell) Donley/Donnelly.
